--- FAMILY MEETING REPORT ---
(Anne Marie Murphy's Family - 01/30/13)

ACTION TAKEN:

On 01/30/13 at approx. 1200 hrs., Det. Rachael Van Ness #1431 and I met with [REDACTED] 04 at their residence at [REDACTED] 03, 04 [REDACTED]. Anne Marie was a Behavioral Therapist for [REDACTED] 01 02 03 12, who was a student in Miss Soto's classroom. Both Anne Marie and [REDACTED] 01 02 03 12 were victims in the Sandy Hook Elementary School shooting. Present for this meeting were the following:

[REDACTED] 04 had not been present at the Group Family Meeting held on 01/15/13 and therefore had not directly received any of the information that was provided by the State Police during that meeting. Det. Van Ness and I subsequently provided him with the following information:

- Location where Anne Marie's and [REDACTED] 01 02 03 12 bodies were found
- Some background history of the shooter and his family
- Family Support Form - written form

Det. Van Ness and I also offered that [REDACTED] 04 could visit the Sandy Hook Elementary School and also receive Anne Marie's clothing or a swatch of it if they wanted. [REDACTED] 04 stated that his family does wish to visit just the outside of the school [REDACTED] 04

[REDACTED] He also stated that he does not want any of the clothing that she was wearing returned at this time. We then explained that we were not disclosing any information about any one specific victim until we had first met privately with that family and provided that information to them and received their approval to share that information with others. [REDACTED] 04 approved to the release of Anne Marie's location information. We also explained to [REDACTED] 04 that we were still confirming if State Police case information or M.E. information could be released pursuant to Freedom of Information Act requests, but that a written request from the families to deny these releases was recommended.

[REDACTED] 04 also expressed concern over the potential mishandling of the extensive donations that had been received in the name of Sandy Hook, although he made it clear that his family did not need any of those donations at this time.

Det. Van Ness had also brought the following property believed to belong to Anne Marie to return to [REDACTED] 04 :

- One (1) black wool JLO by Jennifer Lopez women's coat with a red scarf and gloves
- One (1) set of vehicle keys

[REDACTED] 04 confirmed that they were Anne Marie's at which time, he signed an Inventory Of Property Seized Without A Search Warrant form acknowledging receipt of them (SEE ATTACHED JD-CR-18).

In addition, we asked that the information that we discussed be kept in confidence especially since a majority of it had not been disclosed publicly. Det. Van Ness and I also answered several individual questions and provided [REDACTED] 04 with our contact information before departing at approx. 1330 hrs. This information was then tracked on the Family Folder Checklist in their individual Family Folder.
