Action Taken: On 2/6/13, this Detective received a telephone call from [REDACTED] 01 02 03 12, regarding the ongoing investigation.

[REDACTED] 01 02 03 12 requested assistance in attempting to locate the jacket that [REDACTED] 01 02 03 12 had worn to school on 12/14/12, and described it as being a [REDACTED] 01 02 style jacket that he had purchased for [REDACTED] 01 02 03 12 described [REDACTED] 01 02 03 12 other clothing that day, and advised that he would like all of [REDACTED] 01 02 03 12 clothing returned to him, if possible, inclusive of the jacket if it is located. This Detective advised [REDACTED] 01 02 03 12 that all jackets and coats that could be returned had already been turned over, and that if it had not been returned with [REDACTED] 01 02 03 12 property, then it was possible that it had been contaminated and was destroyed. [REDACTED] 01 02 03 12 stated that he had gotten [REDACTED] 01 02 03 12 backpack back, and was unsure why the coat would have been contaminated but not the backpack, as he knows the students to hang their coats underneath their backpacks in the classroom. [REDACTED] 01 02 03 12 asked if it was possible that [REDACTED] 01 02 03 12 had been wearing the jacket at the time of the shooting, and was advised that since the property receipts for the victim's clothing had not yet been received, that it was a possibility. This Detective agreed to attempt to locate the jacket and stated that she would get back to [REDACTED] 01 02 03 12 with an answer.

This Detective contacted Detective Karoline Keith #533 regarding [REDACTED] 01 02 03 12 clothing seized from the scene, and learned that the jacket described by [REDACTED] 01 02 03 12 was not included in [REDACTED] 01 02 03 12 property.

This Detective spoke with Detective Allegro #950 about the process associated with packing up the decedent's belongings and was advised that in one of the two classrooms many of the jackets were stored inside the backpacks due to a lack of space in the classroom, and that it was possible that the jacket was in [REDACTED] 01 02 03 12 book bag, but that the description of the jacket is not one that he is familiar with having seen. Detective Allegro advised that when he and several other State Police Detectives took over the process of handling the decedent's property within the classrooms, much of the property that was determined to be not salvageable had already been removed, and that he and the other Detectives cleaned what they could and went as far as to cut away any contaminated edges or corners on the children's art or school work so that it could be boxed up and returned to the

This Detective contacted [01 02 03 12] via telephone and relayed the information. [01 02 03 12] stated that he had looked inside [01 02 03 12] backpack only quickly, and would do so again, but was fairly confident that the jacket was not inside. [01 02 03 12] also inquired about whether or not there were any bullets or fragments removed from [01 02 03 12] at autopsy and was advised that this Detective would find out.

This Detective contacted Detectives from the WDMC Van Unit regarding whether or not there were any evidence items removed from [01 02 03 12] at the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner's office and was told that there were no additional exhibits associated with [01 02 03 12] from the autopsy. This Detective contacted [01 02 03 12] and relayed that information.

The status of the case remains actively under investigation.
