DRAWINGS AND WRITING OF STUDENTS IN THE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL LIBRARY

ACTION TAKEN: During the packing and moving of the Sandy Hook Elementary School Library from its current location to its new one at the Chalk Hill School in Monroe, it was learned that writings and drawings made by students while in lock down had been discovered. These drawings were then given to [REDACTED] 04 for safekeeping. I was then tasked with contacting [REDACTED] 04 locating the drawings/writings and evaluate them for content.

On 12/26/12 I contacted [REDACTED] 04 at her home and told her of the reason for contacting her. At that time [REDACTED] 04 informed me that during lock down, in order to keep the children occupied and quiet, she did tear pages out of a spiral notebook and give the students crayons and paper to pass the time. She stated that those pages are in her possession and that she would make them available to whom ever needed them. She also shared that she was leaving later that day [REDACTED] 04. Being unable to meet that day, we made arrangements to meet upon her return on 01/02/13 at approximately 1400 at the Chalk Hill School in Monroe.

On 01/02/13 at approximately 1400 hours, I met with [REDACTED] 04 in the new Sandy Hook School Library located within Monroe's Chalk Hill Middle School. At that time, [REDACTED] 04 told me that at the time of the lock down on December 14th there were nineteen (19) students and four (4) adults, including herself, present in the library at the time of the shooting. 04 stated that she handed out the paper and crayons to keep the children quiet and occupied during the lock down. She then provided me with the twenty-two (22) individual pages she handed out that day. A review of the writings and drawings produced by the students found nothing out of

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the ordinary. There were no specific or implied references to any shooting or gunmen found in any of the documents.

At that time, I took digital photographs of each of pages containing works of the students. These photographs were taken using a department issued Nikon Coolpix L18 Digital Camera. In all, a total of thirty (30) digital images were taken. If a side of a page was blank, no photograph was taken of the blank image. These images were later downloaded and burned to a CD-R. That CD was later forwarded to the State Police Photography Unit for archiving purposes. A copy of the CD-R as well as a print of each of the thirty photographs taken is attached to this report.
