--- INVESTIGATIVE COMMAND POST REPORT ---  
(Newtown EOC - 27 Mile Hill Road South, Newtown, CT.)

**ACTION TAKEN:**

On 12/14/12 at approx. 1130 hrs., the WDMC-A office set up our investigative command post (ICP) for the Sandy Hook School Shooting. The ICP was located at the Newtown Emergency Operations Center (EOC) in the Fairfield Hills facility at 27 Mile Hill Road South, Newtown, CT. In doing this, we utilized the WDMC-A portable command post and the following tasks were assigned:

Numerous other law enforcement agencies and other State Police personnel responded to the ICP to assist in the investigation. We utilized our command post standard operating procedures with State Police Contact Report forms (AKA: Lead Sheets) to list and organize all incoming leads

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and to assign them for proper and timely investigation. These leads were subsequently tracked throughout this portion of the investigation utilizing lead sheet books and a tracking form. An informational briefing was conducted to advise all of the available investigators from the many agencies of these such procedures. The particular experience and resources of these different agencies was considered in the subsequent task organization. Investigative two-person teams were then dispatched to begin investigating the leads.

The conference room at the EOC was set up as the primary command center of the ICP. Informational boards identifying critical information pertaining to the investigation were developed and posted. This information was constantly updated and it was eventually transferred to electronic form for documentation purposes and easier dissemination. Also within this primary room, detectives manned the Investigative Hotlines to identify and properly classify the flood of new incoming leads. Investigators from the CT Intelligence Center assisted with these hotlines and also worked to efficiently communicate important data to other law enforcement agencies, especially concerning numerous related incidents, such as different forms of harassment, threats and fraud.

In an adjacent room, several Federal law enforcement agencies established their working area. Amongst these, the F.B.I. and U.S. Marshals were primarily tasked with following up on out-of-state leads, as well as numerous Internet and electronic related leads. The A.T.F. was tasked with investigating the majority of gun related leads.

Major Crime Unit Commanders, LT David DeVecchia #034 and LT William Baldwin #035 relayed information from the Crime Scenes and the Operational Command Post to the ICP. Daily briefings were usually conducted at the beginning and the end of each day to disseminate any pertinent information and to formulate investigative plans for going forward.

On 12/21/12 at approx. 2000 hrs., the ICP was downsized and relocated to the WDMC-A office in the Troop A barracks in Southbury, where the subsequent investigation still continues as of this writing.
