**GAMING CONSOLES EXAMINATION**

Numerous items were seized by the Connecticut State Police from 36 Yogananda Street in Newtown pursuant to a Connecticut Search and Seizure warrant in connection with the investigation into the mass murder at Sandy Hook Elementary School on 12/14/2012. Shortly thereafter these items were turned over to the FBI for forensic examination, and as a result each item bears a Connecticut State Police exhibit number and an FBI exhibit number. For record keeping and tracking purposes, it should be noted that these items were seized under State Police case number CFS-12-00705354.

The items were returned to the Connecticut State Police on 07/11/2013, at which time Danbury State's Attorney Stephen Sedensky requested that the three video game consoles be re-examined by Connecticut Forensic Science Laboratory to determine if any item contained evidence relevant to the school shooting. Det. Flynn #644 submitted the three consoles to the Forensic Science Laboratory on 07/25/2013 for analysis under Lab ID number ID-12-002105, CSP case number CFS-12-00704597.

The Forensic Lab examined the consoles by connecting them to a monitor, powering them up and viewing the screens as a user would have. Photos were then taken of the various screens to capture and document the information contained on them. The internal hard drives themselves could not be forensically examined due to the proprietary software they are programmed under. The Lab then issued a written report with a CD containing copies of the photographs, both of which are attached to this report.

RESULTS OF EXAMINATION: The gaming history and console information that was displayed on the lab monitor was actually stored on a memory card that was inserted into the console. The games "Dynasty Tactics," "Kingdom Hearts," "Kingdom Hearts II," "Onimusha," "Dynasty Warriors," and "The Two Towers" were found in the gaming history according to the photos provided (but not listed in the Lab report). All of those games are older strategy/fantasy role playing games aimed at preteens/teens, designed for console only use (no online multi-player functionality). It should be noted that this gaming history may not be a complete listing of each game that a user has played on the system in the past. Additionally, no username or other account information was found on the memory card for this gaming system or included in the Lab report.

RESULTS OF EXAMINATION: While viewing the console at the Lab, information including a MAC address of "0050F2C02BB4," a game history for the console and an indication of an Xbox Live user account were found. It should be noted that the MAC address as listed above was not noted in the official written Lab report, but read from the provided photo image and may not be accurate. Also, no specific user name was noted in the official Lab report either, but again a possible user name of "DS9345" was visible in the photo images of the console. The games found in the gaming history (also not listed in the Lab report) included "Call of Duty 2: Big Red One," "Call of Duty: Finest Hour," "Dead or Alive 3," "Halo," "Halo 2," "Lego Star Wars," "MechAssault," Mercenaries," "MGS2 Substance," Panzer Dragoon ORTA," PSO," "Shenmue II," "Spiderman," "Splinter Cell 2," "Splinter Cell-CT," "Star Wars Battlefront," "Star Wars Republic Commando," Tenchu: Return from Darkness," "The Return of the King," and "Worms Forts Under Siege."
