Interview: On 12/14/12, at approximately 1150 hours, this Detective met with [redacted] 04, 03, at the Sandy Hook firehouse with regards to the ongoing investigation. During the interview, [redacted] 04 stated, in part, the following:

That at about 9:30 a.m. on 12/14/12, she was in her [redacted] 04 classroom, Room [redacted] 04 at Sandy Hook Elementary School, when she thought she heard the sound of sheet metal banging, continuously at first, then stopping and starting again, off and on. [redacted] 04 stated that she made eye contact with the teacher, [redacted] 04, and then went out into the hallway to see what the noise was.

[redacted] 04 stated that once in the hallway, she heard the noise start again. [redacted] 04 stated that an unknown male, a father to one of the students in another classroom who had come in to assist with a project, was also out in the hallway, and the two of them started to walk together down the hallway to investigate. [redacted] 04 stated that as they approached [redacted] 04 room, [redacted] 04 ran out and said something about a gun and a shooting.

[redacted] 04 stated that she ordered the male to return to his child's classroom and tell the teacher in the room that the school was in lockdown.

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04 stated that she ran back to Room 04 and closed the door, and 04 locked it. 04 stated that they turned out the lights and got into the cubbies in the room. 04 stated that they all stayed there while 04 read to the students to try to keep them quiet. 04 stated that they could hear the intercom/loudspeaker transmitting, but only heard crying and possibly gunfire over it. 04 stated that she also heard male voices talking at times, but is unsure if the voices were those of the police or not. 04 clarified that the transmissions were hard to understand and there was a lot of static coming across as well. 04 stated that she, 04 and their students remained in the cubby area until the police came and got them.

04 stated that she had tried to call the main office in the school twice, at 9:46 a.m. and again at 9:47 a.m., but got no answer.
