ACTION TAKEN: On 01/11/12 I received the Law Enforcement Case/Incident Report from Captain Robert Cedergren #402, a police officer with the Aquarion Water Company. Cedergren stated that at approximately 9:45 hours, he was contacted by an off duty AWC sergeant regarding DEEP dispatch putting out a general radio call for police assistance to an active shooter incident at a Newtown School. Captain Cedergren stated that he arrived to Sandy Hook Elementary School shortly after 1000 hrs and there was a large police presence. Cedergren stated that he was directed to assist several CSP personnel at the front entrance by Newtown LT Vanghele. Cedergren stated that upon being asked, he retrieved a pry bar tool to free children that were locked in the library. Cedergren stated that upon meeting up with Troopers inside the school, he asked if anyone needed further assistance, saw that the interior scene was secure, and left. While outside the school, he checked to see if anyone needed his assistance and then left the scene. Refer to attached incident report.

CASE STATUS: This case will remain open pending further investigation.



ADDED CHARGES / REMARKS

We determined that the school was the Sandy Hook Elem. School. I went home, collected gunbelt, bodyarmor and AWC police patrol coat and responded to the school in my assigned AWC police vehicle described as an unmarked silver four dr. Chevrolet Colorado pickup truck


For investigative identification purposes I am described as a W/M 51 YOA 6'2" in hgt. and weighing 205 Lbs. grey moustache and hair and glasses. At the time of this incident I was clad in a black AWC police patrol coat and duty gunbelt. Clothing included maroon ballcap, blue jeans and brown workboots.

I responded from home [REDACTED] 03 [REDACTED] Sandy Hook School. I arrived on scene shortly after 1000 Hr. I parked about half way up Dickinson Dr. which is the roadway that leads to the school past the Sandy Hook Fire Dept. building. As I moved on foot toward the school I passed two EMS workers assisting a white female with a bandaged, bleeding foot wound. They were walking on each side of the woman and hurrying with her from the school parking lot toward Dickinson Drive. I also saw two female subjects that seemed to be school kitchen employees running away from the school parking area on Dickinson Rd. toward the Fire Station. I came to other EMS and fire personnel staged at the beginning of the parking lot. As I passed I heard reports that a second shooter was possibly still at large.

There were several police vehicles parked at the front of the parking lot. I saw several officers with long guns positioned about the front of the school and in perimeter defensive positions. I observed a white male seated on the ground in handcuffs against a parked car. A police officer was guarding this individual. I saw Newtown Police Chief Michael Kehoe and Newtown Lt. Chris Vanghele in front of the school near a black NPD unmarked Ford Explorer.

I spoke briefly with Chief Kehoe, Lt. Vanghele then told me that there had been a shooting in the school and that there was possibly a second shooter at large. Lt. Vanghele pointed out a blue four door sedan parked in front of the school main entrance as the suspect vehicle, he mentioned that the presence of two sweatshirts near the car on the ground served as a possible indicator of the involvement of multiple offenders. Lt. Vanghele sent me to a group of several CSP troopers gathered at the front door of the school to assist them as directed. As I reported there the CSP Troopers had just received word that there were children locked in the library, they asked if I had a prybar tool and I returned quickly to my truck and retrieved it, then ran back to the school building. When I arrived back at the front door there was only one trooper at the perimeter tape, he sent me into the building with the prybar to assist the troopers who had already entered the building.

I am familiar with the layout of the Sandy Hook School. The front door glass was smashed out and the doors were open. I walked into the Lobby and turned left toward the Library. I saw blood on the floor and observed two female decedents lying supine on the right side of the hallway just past the Main Office. As I passed by I observed that the two individuals were lying together and there was significant blood around them on the hallway floor. The aforementioned CSP Troopers were further down the hallway along with a Newtown Officer. I indicated that I had returned with the prybar, they in turn reported that entry had just been gained to the room.

At this point the interior scene was secure, having no other purpose for being there I began to leave. I met Danbury Hospital Paramedic John Reed at the door to a classroom, one of the row of rooms that face the front parking area. I asked Reed if he needed assistance or supplies, he responded in the negative and stated that there was little left for him to do.

As I passed Medic Reed I saw an obviously dead male individual lying on his side on the floor inside the door of the classroom. The decedent was small in stature and had dark hair. I saw that he had a pistol holster on his thigh and he was clad in a vest carrier. There was a black pistol on the floor by the decedent that I recognized as a Glock, the slide seemed to be partially or fully open.

I left immediately via the same route by which I had entered. Total time spent inside the building was probably less than one minute.

Upon leaving the building I reported to Lt. Vanghele, he requested that I obtain crime scene tape and secure the perimeter around the suspect vehicle. I went back to my police vehicle, obtained the tape, returned to the scene and found that someone else had draped tape around the car in the interim. I spoke again with Lt. Vanghele and left him my roll of tape. As he had no other immediate assignments I went with other officers to the front part of the lot and waited for orders.

I made a telephone call to AWC Police Chief Ralph Fensore and advised him of my status, he requested periodic updates of my activity. By this point in time many officers including CSP Command Staff arrived on scene and began to organize ample personnel. As I returned to my patrol vehicle I met with Redding PD Officer Chris Vadas and we left the scene together in my police vehicle driving west on Riverside Rd. I met Bethel Police Chief Jeffrey Finch and Sgt. Michael Libertini as they arrived on scene, we spoke briefly and then Vadas and I left the area.

I drove Ofc. Vadas to his nearby home. I returned to my home where I dressed in full AWC police uniform and proceeded to the Newtown PDHQ at Main Street. I checked in at Dispatch and was directed to Desk Sgt. Wisentanner, making myself available for service as required. Sgt. Wisentanner sent me to the Newtown Emergency Operations Center in Fairfield Hills where I met briefly with NPD Lt. Richard Robinson. Thereafter I was detailed to bring supplies to the Sandy Hook Fire Station where the Incident Command Post had been established. I completed this assignment and returned to the EOC. By this point in time, at about 1300 hr. the police reponse was nearly overwhelming for police managers. With adequate police personnel on hand I left the EOC and went off-duty.
