As all of this was unfolding, parents and loved ones began to show up at the Sandy Hook Firehouse. The students were separated from the general public in the rear room of the firehouse and parents were becoming extremely agitated at the fact that they were separated from them. A decision was made by the school staff to allow the parents and students to wait together but no one was permitted to leave the firehouse. There was no police oversight of the students at this point.

I checked with Chief Kehoe to see if he had assigned anyone to supervise the reunification process at the firehouse. He had not, and when I offered to assist in that endeavor – he agreed. I met with the three Newtown Police School Resource Officers who were on scene, found a bull horn from inside of one of the fire trucks, and together we began to gain some sense of order within the firehouse bays.

All students were organized, with great assistance from one of the Sandy Hook staff 04 15, by class. The decision was made to allow all students who were not immediately adjacent to the shooting scene to leave the firehouse. All students were signed out by a parent and their dismissal documented. All students who appeared to be a witness to the event were identified and their names given to the Connecticut State Police. These dismissals were documented as well. Once parents were reunited with their students, they were strongly encouraged to leave the firehouse to alleviate some of the chaos.

As the reunification process progressed we developed two groups of individuals: 1) Students without parents (who had yet to arrive) and, 2) Parents or loved ones without students. These groups were separated from everyone else. The students (waiting for parents) were placed in the center room of the firehouse and were guarded by a police officer and school staff. All remaining dismissals took place from that room. The parents and loved ones who could not locate their students and/or staff were sent to the rear room of the firehouse where they all gathered together. Media was kept out of both of these locations.

Ultimately, that rear room was used by those responsible for making formal notification(s) to the families.

All staff from Sandy Hook School was gathered and each member was interviewed by the State Police in the firehouse. We also spent a few minutes with the staff discussing with them what to expect and praising their heroic efforts. We ultimately made sure that everyone had a ride home as well.

Within a couple of hours, all students present were properly dismissed.
