Cathryn M. Dahlmeyer, D.O.B. 03

Interview: On 12/14/12, at approximately 1336 hours, this Detective met with Cathryn Dahlmeyer, D.O.B. 03, at the Sandy Hook firehouse with regards to the ongoing investigation. During the interview, Dahlmeyer stated, in part, the following:

That she is an AEMT with Newtown Ambulance, and had worked the overnight shift into the morning of 12/14/12. Dahlmeyer stated that she had gone home to sleep after her shift ended, and at approximately 0930 hours, she was laying in her bed at her residence when she heard gun shots. Dahlmeyer stated that she prayed that the noise was from a car backfiring, but did not believe that was the case.

Dahlmeyer stated that she turned on her radio and heard the tone and message to stage with the ambulances at the Methodist Church on Church Hill Road transmit over the radio. Dahlmeyer stated that she dressed and looked outside, observing a line of police cars turning onto Dickinson.

Dahlmeyer stated that she responded to the Methodist Church to stage and got into the back of the ambulance. Dahlmeyer stated that she gave out gloves and hung IV bags in preparation while the ambulance moved over behind the firehouse. Dahlmeyer stated that as they pulled up, the police waved them in immediately and they pulled up to the stop sign where she saw Newtown Police Officer Chapman kneeling down with a young female

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shooting victim across his knee. Dahlmeyer stated that they immediately dumped the stretcher and loaded the child into the ambulance, working her all the way to the hospital. Dahlmeyer stated that the child had sustained multiple gunshot wounds in the incident, and estimated the child victim to be between 6 and 8 years of age.

The status of the case remains actively under investigation.
