



# SCENE REPORT

(INSIDE SCENE: Sandy Hook Elementary School)

### DATE AND TIME OF INVESTIGATION:

On Friday, December 14, 2012 beginning at approximately 1546 hours and concluding on Thursday, December 20th, 2012 at approximately 2130 hours detectives of the Western District Major Crime (WDMC) Van Squad processed the interior scene of a mass murder shooting investigation at the Sandy Hook Elementary School located at 12 Dickinson Drive in the Sandy Hook section of the Town of Newtown, Connecticut. This scene was processed under the authority of a Consent to Search.

LOCATION OF INCIDENT: This scene was located at the Sandy Hook Elementary School located at 12 Dickinson Drive in the Sandy Hook section of the Town of Newtown, Connecticut.

#### SUMMARY:

On Friday, December 14, 2012 beginning at approximately 0935 hours, the Newtown Police Department received a 911 call from the Sandy Hook Elementary School at 12 Dickinson Drive in the Sandy Hook section of the Town of Newtown, Connecticut from an unknown female stating that there was shooting within the Sandy Hook Elementary School. Newtown Police, State Police and Emergency Responders (ie: Ambulance and Fire Personnel) responded to the school for this active shooter complaint. The WDMC Van Squad was on scene at approximately 1140 hours but was staged at the Sandy Hook

Firehouse until such time as the scene was safe to approach. The WDMC Van Squad Squad was tasked with processing the inside of the Sandy Hook Elementary School, while the Central District Major Crime (CDMC) Van Squad was tasked with processing the exterior of the Sandy Hook Elementary School. (Please Refer to the CDMC Van Squad Reports relative to their assignments).

At the time of this incident the weather was dry, clear and sunny with temperatures in the 40s. At approximately 1330 hours, the WDMC Van Squad was positioned in front of the Sandy Hook Elementary School and members of the WDMC Van Squad conducted a walk-thru of the scene from approximately 1412 hours to 1426 hours. Videotape documentation began at approximately 1546 hours. Processing of this scene by the WDMC Van Squad continued for seven (7) days and at all times the WDMC Van Squad remained on scene and at all times this scene remained secured by uniformed State Police personnel.

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person. On Saturday, 12/15/2012, the shooter was transported from the scene to the OCME in Farmington, Connecticut, for an autopsy at a later time.

#### **CLOTHING PROCESSING**

On 12/15/2012 at 1751 hours, Central District Major Crime (CDMC) Detective Greenstein transported the clothing, ballistic evidence, and jewelry seized from the deceased victims during autopsy from the OCME in Farmington, Connecticut, to the previously mentioned large military-style portable tent that was located on scene. WDMC Sergeant Covello assisted by FBI Agents Lisa Skelly, Sammy DiPasquale and TFC Kenneth Dillon systematically hung the clothing numerically associated to exhibit number and OCME number. Once the clothing was dry, it was subsequently processed by WDMC Van Squad detectives, FBI Agents Lisa Skelly, Sammy DiPasquale and TFC Kenneth Dillon within an adjoining tent on scene. Processing of some of the clothing started on Monday, 12/17/2012 beginning at 2000 hours and concluded on Tuesday, 12/18/2012 at 0020 hours. Processing of the clothing resumed again on Tuesday 12/18/2012 at 1000 hours and concluded at 1933 hours. Each victim's clothing was individually packaged and secured collectively into a banker's box with the victim's name and clothing exhibit number on the box. Clothing evidence was documented from Exhibit #55 thru Exhibit #77. (REFER TO SGT. COVELLO'S NEXGEN REPORT #00019254).

On 12/15/2012 at 1751 hours, CDMC Van Squad Detective Greenstein transported clear plastic vials that contained ballistic evidence consisting of copper and lead fragments. These vials containing ballistic evidence were seized at the time of autopsy from each of the victims by the medical examiner. These items were turned over at autopsy to CDMC Detective Greenstein and transported by him from the OCME in Farmington, Connecticut to the scene and turned over to WDMC Detective Sliby #810 (Evidence Officer at this scene). The ballistic evidence was documented from Exhibit #101 thru #126. It was noted that vials of copper and lead fragments were collected from each victim.

The clothing (Exhibit #83) and a Gun Shot Residue Kit (Exhibit #100) seized by CDMC Van Squad Detective Greenstein at the autopsy of the shooter on 12/16/2012, were transported to Litchfield, Connecticut, and secured by WDMC Detective Rupsis #1260 into the WDMC Evidence Drying Cage in Litchfield, Connecticut.

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This clothing was processed further on 01/17/2013 by Detective Walkley #589 and Detective Keith #533. (REFER TO SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT RELATIVE TO PROCESSING THE SHOOTER'S CLOTHING).

#### OVERALL SCENE

According to Vision Government Solutions Inc. Assessor's online database, the property of Sandy Hook Elementary School was located at 12 Dickinson Drive in Newtown, Connecticut, and was documented as a 1 story building with a brick veneer exterior. This building was listed as a public school owned by the Town of Newtown. This building was documented as being 66,027 square feet and was built in 1954. It should be noted that I observed the exterior of the building to be constructed of brick and not brick veneer. It should also be noted that the sign for the Sandv Hook Elementary School denoted its established date as 1956. (The Town of Newtown contracted with Vision Government Solutions Inc. of Northboro, Massachusetts to assist with the state mandated revaluation project. The above information was obtained from the Assessor's online database for the Town of Newtown, CT). Refer to the attached Vision Appraisal Data.

The building was located at the end of Dickinson Drive. Dickinson Drive was located off the south side of Riverside Road and traveled in a southeast direction and curved in a south west direction to a large parking lot at the front (northeast) side of the school. At the intersection of Dickinson Drive and Riverside Road was the Sandy Hook Volunteer Fire and Rescue Company (18 Riverside Road).

The school building was positioned with its front entrance patio and lobby area facing in a magnetic northeast direction; however for report purposes NORTH will be designated as the front of the school which includes the patio, lobby, and the exterior sides of rooms 12 through 2. The parking lot will be designated in this report as being located on the north side of the school.

The school was designed in a rectangular shape with four hallways in the main building and portable classrooms attached to the rear (south) side and accessed from a hallway located in the center south side of the main building. Classrooms located on the exterior walls of the building were even numbered and those on the interior walls of the building were odd numbered. The north hallway contained the lobby, main office that also contained the nurse's office, rooms numbered 1-10, and 12. [NOTE: Det. Sliby refers in the Exhibit Report as this being the East-West hallway]. This area was the area that processing was concentrated, however the remainder of the school

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was documented through videography. (Refer to Video Report by Detective Rupsis: Nexgen Report #00104381). The west hallway contained the cafeteria, staff lounge, custodial office, gymnasium and rooms numbered 19, 20, 21, 23, 24, 25, 27 and 29. [NOTE: Det. Sliby refers in the Exhibit Report as this being the North-South hallway]. The south hallway contained the media center, and rooms 26, 28, 30-38, 40 &42. The east hallway contained the rooms numbered 46, 48-54, and 56. The portable classrooms located to the south of the main building housed rooms numbered 62, 64, and 68 including a group work room. There was a courtyard located in the center open area of the school building.

#### CONDITIONS OF DOORS AND WINDOWS

All windows and doors were documented within this report; however, it should be considered that the positions of the doors were changed during the emergency response and protective sweep of this building by police and emergency personnel.

Only three (3) areas had damage consistent with having been forcibly entered: (1) The front (north) window adjacent to the west side of the front lobby doors was broken with a large hole visible. (2) Classroom #3 interior door between Classroom #3 and Classroom #5 was observed to be forcibly entered to gain access into Classroom #5 with the words "Breach" written on the door. Classroom #5 hallway door was locked and not breached. (3) The north window on the south-east exterior side door was reportedly breached by police to gain entry through this door from this side of the building. This door was located between classroom #46 and classroom #48 and provided access into the east hallway. Police reports indicate that this door was breached by Newtown Police Officer Seabrook. (Refer to Det. Lukienchuk's Nexgen Report #29085).

#### OVERALL DESCRIPTION OF THE NORTH HALLWAY ROOMS

Rooms in the north hallway were all observed by me to be unlocked with the exception of classroom #5. All doors opened outward toward the hallway with all classroom doors recessed within the hallway, with the exception of rooms 11A-5 (Storage Closet), #9 (Conference Room), #1 (Miss. Pasani's Room) and #2. All door handles had a key lock on the outside of the door handle and no locking device on the inside. All doors were solid wood with a large circular window in the upper half of the door. Only Classroom #5 and #12 had their classroom door windows completely covered. Classroom #6 had an "Apple" decoration hanging on the inside portion of the window that partially blocked the view into the room through a closed door. All classrooms had a bathroom and a closet contained within the classroom. The bathrooms in the

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north hallway classrooms were uniformly designed approximately 4'7" east to west and 3 feet ½ inch north to south. The door of each bathroom opened inward and away from the toilet. Each bathroom door had a knob push button lock on the inside and a key lock on the outside. The conference room did not have a bathroom. At the time of processing this scene, in the north hallway, only classroom #5 was locked from both the hallway and the interior door connecting Room #3.

The following rooms in the north hallway have an interior door that is shared by the two classrooms: #12 and #10, #8 and #6, #6 and #4 and #3 and #5.

#### WALKTHROUGH

On Friday, 12/14/2012, between 1412 hours and 1426 hours, members of the WDMC Van Squad conducted a walk-through of the scene. The purpose of the walk-through is to identify transient and conditional evidence, as well as to determine order and methods of processing. During the walkthrough and during the processing of this scene, members of the WDMC Van Squad wore Tyvek coveralls, latex gloves, masks and booties as deemed necessary.

#### PROCESSING COMMENCES

Processing began with videotaped documentation on Friday, 12/14/2012 at 1546 hours. Photographic documentation began on this same day at 1617 hours.

#### FRONT ENTRANCE/PATIO AREA

The patio area was located north of the main entrance to the lobby of the school. The patio floor was concrete and recessed into the east portion of the north side of the school. The east brick wall of the patio area constituted the west wall of classroom #12. The west brick wall of the patio area constituted the east wall of the mechanical area. The patio area had a roof covering and shrubbery plantings in the center portion of the patio. The shrubbery plantings were located west of the main entrance doors and north of the lobby windows. There were blood-like stains, consistent with drip stains, located on the concrete floor of the patio in the area north of the exterior door. These blood-like stains collectively comprised a drip trail and were consistent with first responding officers' statements as being attributed to the injured persons that were removed from the school during this incident. The exterior door of the mechanical area on the west side of the patio was observed to be partially open. The hilt of the knob was broken and the knob was unlocked. The kitchen area within the school could be accessed from a door this mechanical room.

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The main entrance consisted of two locked full glass doors that were both hinged on the east side and opened outwardly using a pull handle. These doors were secured with an electronic locking mechanism and require the door to be unlocked electronically or opened from the inside. The doors could be opened from the inside with a Safety Door Exit Device with Extruded Aluminum Mechanism Housing (push bar). This push bar design was mounted horizontally across the middle portion of the door. These doors provided access to a vestibule. There are two locked doors on the south side of the vestibule that provide access into the lobby of the school. These two doors were similar to the entrance doors with full glass, hinge on the east side and a push bar design. The vestibule was made up of a cinderblock wall on the east side that was also the west wall with classroom #12. There were three (3) full length windows on the west side and the two entrance doors to the lobby on the south side of the vestibule.

On the exterior side of the main entrance doorway, adjacent to the west side of the west entrance door to the vestibule, was a "call box" buzzer system with a video camera. Gino Faiella (Director of Facilities for the Newtown Schools) stated that this call box was installed seven (7) years ago, 2005, and confirmed that the video camera does not record. The call box video is viewed live on three (3) monitoring systems located on the three (3) secretary desks in the main office with no recording capabilities. The electronic unlocking of the front doors is done by using a "key button" on any of the three (3) monitoring systems. (For further details refer to Det. Mudry's Nexgen Report #74667)

Adjacent to the west side of the front entrance doors were six (6) large pane glass windows that made up the north wall of the lobby area. The large pane windows measured individually approximately 85 ½ inches high and 49 inches wide. The large pane of glass immediately adjacent to the west side of the west main entrance door was broken with a large oval shaped opening in the glass. This broken area in the glass measured approximately 35 1/3 inches wide and 42 ½ inches high. Glass shards were located on the patio and plantings in the area adjacent to the north side (outside) of the glass window area and also on the tile floor in the lobby. **Eight (8) expended brass colored casings,** each with the head stamp "S&B 60 5.56x45", were located in the patio area just north of the broken window and front entrance doors. These casings were seized as Exhibit #5 and Exhibit #94.

#### LOBBY

The lobby measured approximately 28 feet north to south and 36 feet east to west. The lobby was accessed upon entry into the school from the main entrance on the north side of the school. The southeast corner of the lobby allowed open access to

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the north hallway of the school. The southwest corner of the lobby allowed open access to the west hallway of the school. The cafeteria could be accessed through a door on the west wall of the lobby. This door opened into the lobby. The cafeteria door was wooden and had a circular window in the upper portion of the door. This door was found in the open position. The kitchen of the cafeteria could be accessed through a door on the west wall of the lobby, north of the cafeteria doors. This door had no window and was found in the open position. The main office could be accessed from a door on the south wall of the lobby. This office door was comprised of solid wood with a narrow vertical window located to the east side and upper portion of the door. There were four large square windows with four small rectangular windows above them on the south wall of the lobby (north wall of the office). These windows were located east of the office entrance door. Each window and the door window of the office were comprised of diamond wire glass. There was a long brown wooden bench located under the windows of the office on the south wall of the lobby.

The floor in the lobby was made up of square two foot by two foot black, brown and white porcelain tile. The lobby ceiling was approximately 8 feet high. The walls were comprised of white painted cinder block over tan colored tile with a blue painted divide between them. The lower portion of the wall was approximately 4 feet 7 inches of tan colored tile and the upper portion was approximately 3 feet four inches of white painted cinder block. **Sixteen (16) brass colored expended bullet casings,** bearing the head stamp "S&B 60 5.56x45", were located on the floor and within the lobby area. The expended casings were seized as Exhibit #6.

Adjacent to the south side of the north windows in the lobby were assorted display cases, magazine racks and furniture. In the center west side of the lobby area was a wood table with six (6) wood framed with blue cushioned chairs. Adjacent to the east side of the lobby area against the west glass wall of the vestibule were two (2) wood framed, with blue cushion, chairs and a wood, with blue cushion, love seat. Adjacent to the west side of the broken window on the north wall of the lobby was a wooden magazine rack and a wood framed, with blue cushion, chair. The magazine rack and one of the wooden framed chairs on the east side of the wood table had holes consistent with bullet holes within them. There was a stack of magazines in the magazine rack that had a hole consistent with a bullet hole going through the stack of magazines. The stack of magazines was seized collectively as Exhibit #132. The magazine rack and the chairs appeared to be out of place and a potted plant was tipped over consistent with a person or persons entering the lobby through the large hole in the glass on the north wall adjacent to the west side of the entrance door.

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There were eleven (11) damaged areas consistent with bullet strikes in the lobby area. These bullet strikes were located within the cinder block and tile covered walls of the south wall of the lobby and west wall of the west hallway, as well as a display case on the south wall of the lobby, a magazine rack, coffee table and a chair located in the northern portion of the lobby. On the south wall of the lobby, west of the main office door, was a large built in display case with sliding glass doors and decorative arrangements. Beneath this display case was a free standing glass display case table with assorted decorative arrangements. This free standing display case had a hole in the glass that was consistent with a bullet hole located in the front (north) portion of the west side. This free standing display case was seized as Exhibit #133. Picture frames hanging on the west wall of the west hallway in the area of the lobby were damaged with holes consistent with bullet holes. The cinderblock walls behind the picture frames had damage consistent with divots made by a projectile passing through the picture frames and hitting the wall. No projectiles were observed in these divots. Two of these damaged picture frames were seized as Exhibit #130 and Exhibit #131. Exhibit #130 was a glass encased framed picture of "Red Slider" with a bullet hole and Exhibit #131 was a glass encased framed picture of "A Bear Named Trouble" with a bullet hole. There were two (2) copper-like projectiles seized from the west hallway, with one being adjacent to the gym (center of west hallway) seized as Exhibit #15 and the other being at the south end of the west hallway, seized as Exhibit #16. (The locations of the bullet strikes in the lobby labeled BH#1 thru BH #11 were measured into a sketch map for documentation by the CSP-CARS UNIT. REFER TO THE SKETCH MAP AND ASSOCIATED REPORTS COMPLETED BY THE CARS UNIT).

#### NORTH HALLWAY

The north hallway, as previously mentioned, contained the lobby, main office, nurse's room, rooms 1-10, and 12. The north hallway floor was made up of square two foot by two foot black, brown and white porcelain-like tile. The ceiling was approximately 8 feet high and the width of the hallway was approximately 8 feet 5 inches. The walls were comprised of white painted cinder block over tan colored tile with a blue painted divide between them. The lower portion of the wall was approximately 4 feet 7 inches of tan colored tile and the upper portion was approximately 3 feet 4 inches of white painted cinder block.

The even numbered rooms were on the north side of the hallway with classroom #12 being the western-most classroom and classroom #2 being the eastern-most. The odd numbered rooms were on the south side of the hallway with the main office being the western-most room and classroom #1 being the eastern-most. East of the main

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office is a closet labeled "11A-5 storage" and east of the closet was a conference room identified as Room #9.

In the western-most area of the north hallway, before entry into the lobby area, were two deceased adult females, later identified as Principal Dawn Hochsprung (OCME#12-17592) and School Psychologist Mary Sherlach (OCME#12-17595). There was a writing easel lying on its side to the west of the victims. Newtown Police Detective Jason Frank reported to me that he put this easel in this location to prevent exiting children from seeing the victims.

- ) #3 [OCME#12-17592] was lying on her Dawn Hochsprung (d.o.b. 03 back in a position with her head to the west and her feet to the east, with her right side adjacent to the south wall of the hallway. Mrs. Hochsprung was positioned west of Mrs. Sherlach and east of the wooden bench located in the lobby beneath the main office windows. Mrs. Hochsprung's feet were touching Mrs. Sherlach's left shoulder. Mrs. Hochsprung had brown hair and was wearing a grey and red hooded sweater, red long sleeve shirt, blue jeans and calf-length brown colored boots. She had a ring on her right ring finger and a bracelet on her left wrist. There was a gold colored necklace in close proximity to the west side of her head. Jewelry seized at autopsy includes a gold colored ring, two silver colored rings (1 with a clear stone), gold colored chain necklace, two gold colored studded earrings, two gold colored with clear stone studded earrings, a charm bracelet, a wrist watch with a brown leather band and a gold colored bracelet. [Clothing seized from OCME as Exhibit **#71**]
- Mary Sherlach (d.o.b. 03 ) #4 [OCME#12-17595] was positioned lying on her back with her head to the south and her feet to the north and her head adjacent to the south side of the hallway. Mrs. Sherlach was wearing a blue long sleeve shirt, tan tank top shirt, blue jeans, blue socks with brown colored shoes. There was a pair of eyeglasses on the floor east of her body. There was a blue colored material around her head that was possibly a head dress or large neck scarf. Jewelry seized at autopsy includes two (2) silver colored hoop earrings each with a blue colored stone, silver colored wrist watch, black framed "JM New York" brand reading glasses (+2.50), four (4) gold colored rings (3 with stones). [Clothing seized from OCME as Exhibit #58]

Both victims were lying in pools of a blood-like substance appearing to originate from relative wounds on their bodies. Spatter of a blood-like substance was evident on the south wall of the hallway in the area of the two victims. The spatter was measured to

a range no higher than 2 feet 1 inch from the floor. The spatter areas had characteristics of various different spatter patterns. One (1) brass colored expended bullet casing, bearing the head stamp "S&B 60 5.56x45", was located and seized as Exhibit #78, from the floor in the location of Mrs. Hochsprung and Mrs. Sherlach.

There was a blue folder, with the name 01 02 written on it, located on the floor in the hallway west of the storage closet (denoted 11A-5). There were stains consistent with blood-like stains on the floor and east door jamb of the Room #9 (Conference Room) doorway. There was a stain consistent with a contact transfer pattern of a blood-like stain on the inside lower portion of the Room #9 (Conference Room) door. Two swabs of this blood-like stain were seized as Exhibit #89. Sqt. Cario reported to me that the area of this blood-like stain, in the threshold of Room #9, was the location he found a woman, later identified as Natalie Hammond. He placed her in a chair within the conference room until such time as she could be removed from the school for further treatment.

There was a hole consistent with a bullet hole (BH-12) in the bore side of the door to Room #9 (Conference Room). This door opened outward into the hallway with the hinge side on the west side. The damage to the door was consistent with this door having been open to some degree at the time the projectile passed through it. This door was wooden with a large circular window on the upper portion of the door. There was yellow caution tape applied to the hallway floor in the area of the conference door. On the floor of the hallway, within this rectangular area marked with caution tape adjacent to Room #9 (Conference Room) was a lead-like projectile that was seized as Exhibit #7. There was a hole consistent with a bullet hole (BH-13) in the south wall of the hallway adjacent to the east side of the east door jamb of Room #9 (Conference Room). (The locations of these bullet strikes labeled BH#12 thru BH #13 were measured into a sketch map for documentation by the CSP-CARS UNIT. REFER TO THE SKETCH MAP AND ASSOCIATED REPORTS COMPLETED BY THE CARS UNIT).

There were Police and EMS belongings on the north hallway floor adjacent to the west side of Room #5 to include two "Life Pacs." On the floor in the north hallway was a tan bin containing children's books located on the floor adjacent to the west side of classroom #10 and on the east side of classroom #7. Also on the north hallway floor located west of classroom #7 was a 01 02 back pack.

One (1) brass colored expended bullet casing bearing the head stamp "10mm Auto" was located and seized as Exhibit #8 from the south side of the north hallway floor just east of the conference room (Room #9).

On the floor on the north side of the north hallway west of classroom #6 and east of classroom #8 were **four (4) live rounds** of 5.56 mm ammunition with the head stamp "S&B 60 5.56x45" (Seized as Exhibits #9-12). Adjacent to these live rounds was a "PMAG 30" black plastic magazine that contained **eleven (11) live rounds** of 5.56 ammunition. This magazine and the eleven (11) live rounds were seized as Exhibit #13.

At the southeast side of the north hallway was classroom #1 (Mrs. Perry and Miss Pisani). The door was located on the south wall of the north hallway and was located east of the east hallway. The door was not recessed into the hallway but instead opened directly into the hallway and was hinged on the east side. There was a hole, consistent with a bullet hole in the interior side of the lower portion the door to classroom #1. This projectile perforated the door leaving a hole on the exterior side of the door (BH#17) and a hole (BH#16) in the east wall of the north hallway to the south of classroom #1C (Custodial Closet). These series of holes are consistent with the door having been fully opened at the time the projectile inflicted the damage to the door.

There was a second hole in the east wall of the north hallway, in close proximity to the previously mentioned hole, also consistent with a bullet hole (BH-#15). This hole did not line up with any of the previously mentioned other holes in the door to classroom #1 and therefore would have occurred when the door was not fully open. There was a hole in the door for Room #1C (Custodial Closet) on the east wall of the north hallway in close proximity to the previously mentioned hole #15. This hole was also consistent with a bullet hole (BH-14). A copper jacketed projectile was seized as Exhibit #14 from the hallway area in close proximity to the threshold of classroom #1 entrance door from this hallway. There were blood-like stains on the floor in the hallway adjacent to the north side of classroom #1. There were blood-like stain areas consistent with shoe wear transfer patterns traveling from this hallway door into classroom #1, in a southeast direction, to the teacher's desk and then in a northeastern direction to the northeast exit door, into a vestibule, and out the exit door on the northeast side of the school. (The locations of these bullet strikes labeled BH#14 thru BH #17 were measured into a sketch map for documentation by the CSP-CARS UNIT. REFER TO THE SKETCH AND ASSOCIATED REPORTS COMPLETED BY THE CARS UNIT).

During processing, a purse with personal documents and a Connecticut Driver's License identifying this purse belonging to 04 was located in the north wall closet of classroom #1. This purse was inventoried in the presence of Lieutenant David DelVecchia. This purse contained seventeen (\$17) dollars (1 ten

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The Emergency Evacuation Map was located inside Room #9 on the eastern door trim and was seized as Exhibit #82.

#### CLASSROOM #12 (Miss. Riog)

Classroom #12 was located on the north side of the north hallway and was the first classroom east of the front lobby. This classroom door was located approximately 23 feet east of the lobby and is accessed from a door that was recessed within the north side of the north hallway. As previously mentioned, the door opened outward (toward the hallway) and was wooden with a large circular window in the upper portion. This door was hinged on the east side. The window was covered on the outside (hallway side) with dark colored paper. The door could only be locked by using a key on the exterior door handle key lock. The interior door handle had no locking mechanism. This room was measured to be approximately 27 feet east to west and 30 feet north to south with carpeted floors and painted cinderblock walls.

Fluorescent ceiling lights automatically turned on when entering the room.

There were eight large glass windows across the north wall which provided a view into the front (north) parking lot of the school and a partial view of the front patio area. There were four panes of glass to each large window. The top and second from the bottom panes opened up in a push-style manner. None of these windows appeared to be open. These windows had four (4) venetian blinds that covered two (2) windows each. The western-most blind was fully open and the blind was fully retracted toward the ceiling. The blind adjacent to the western-most blind was extended approximately 3/4 length of the window and partially closed. The other two blinds were extended approximately 3/4 the length of the window and in the open position. There were large posters across the lower portion of the windows limiting the view into the parking lot, with the exception of the two western-most windows. There was a book case along the entire north wall under the windows that stood approximately 2 feet 5 inches high and 1 foot 6 inches deep. There were posters across the lower portion of the windows partially but not completely limiting the view into the parking lot. There were stacks of items and supplies on the top of the bookcase under the windows that partially blocked the view from these eight (8) windows.

The teacher's desk was located in the northwest corner of the room. On the south side of the teacher's desk was a white bag with an orange wallet that contained the Connecticut driver's license for Kaitlin Mary Roig (d.o.b. 03 ). There was also a set of keys on the desk to include a vehicle key for a "BMW". The west wall of the classroom was a shared wall with the front lobby of the school. The northwest corner of this classroom was closest to the area of the front entrance to the school.

There was a bathroom located within the classroom in the southwest corner of the room. This bathroom had a door knob with a pushbutton locking device on the inside knob. The exterior knob had a key lock that could be used to unlock the door. There was a black scarf on the floor in the bathroom as well as some miscellaneous papers that appeared to have fallen off the exterior portion of the bathroom door. This bathroom door opened inward and was hinged on the east side. On the west wall north of the bathroom door was a sink with under/over cabinets. There was a large standing wood colored rolling cabinet with the word "Math" on it that appeared out of place. This cabinet was haphazardly positioned partially against the northeast corner of the sink cabinets. Sgt. Cario reported to me that this rolling cabinet was originally located in front of the bathroom door, preventing his view of the bathroom door. Sgt. Cario moved this rolling cabinet to access the bathroom in this room. [REFER TO SGT. WILLIAM CARIO'S NEXGEN REPORT #00026724].

This room appeared to be a typically furnished classroom, with three (3) clusters of desks and chairs positioned around the room. There was a cluster of four desks in the southeast side of the room, the center east side of the room and the center west side of the room. These desks appeared neat and orderly with the exception of one desk tipped on its side. This desk was the western-most desk of a cluster of four desks located in the southeast side of the room, northwest of the entrance door. There was an oval table near the center portion of the west wall.

There was a rectangular table adjacent to the center portion of the north wall, east of the teacher's desk. There was a smart board located in the north side of the east wall. There was a speaker above the smart board. There was a storage closet in the southeast corner of the room. The closet door had no locking mechanism.

There was a door that provided access into classroom #10 on the center of the east wall south of the smart board. This door opened into classroom #12 and was hinged on the north side. This door had a key lock on both sides of the handle and was unlocked. At the conclusion of processing this room, members of the Connecticut Forensic Lab were requested to review the processing efforts of the Western District Major Crime Squad. Specific to this room the lab personnel suggested that both handles of this door were swabbed in effort to collect any genetic material that may later determine if the shooter's DNA is present on these door handles. These swabs were seized as Exhibit #87 (swab from the handle on the classroom #12 side) and Exhibit #88 (swab from the handle on the classroom #10 side).

There was a cream colored wall mounted telephone located on the south side of the east wall, north of the closet. An "Emergency Response Plan" packet was hanging on the south wall adjacent to the east side of the entrance door. This packet was above a laminated map depicting the emergency evacuation route for this classroom. The "Emergency Response Plan" packet was seized as Exhibit #79. There were open wooden standing cubbies positioned in an "L" shape formation on the west side of the entrance door. These cubbies appeared to hold the personal belongings of the students. On top of one of the cubbies in close proximity to the west side of the entrance door was a cell phone. This cell phone was seized as Exhibit #86 (One (1) black colored "Blackberry" cellular phone with Sprint logo).

### CLASSROOM #10 (Miss. Soto)

Classroom #10 was located on the north side of the north hallway and was the second classroom east of the front lobby. The hallway doorway for classroom #10 was approximately 27 feet east of classroom #12. This classroom was accessed from a door that was recessed within the north side of the north hallway. As previously mentioned, the door opened outward (toward the hallway) and was wooden with a large circular window in the upper portion. This door was hinged on the east side. This window was not completely covered but did have a decoration over part of the inside of the window. The door could only be locked by using a key on the exterior door handle key lock. The interior door handle had no locking mechanism. This room measured approximately 27 feet east to west and 30 feet north to south. This room was carpeted with painted cinderblock walls. Fluorescent ceiling lights automatically turned on when entering the room.

There were eight (8) large glass windows across the north wall with four (4) rectangular panes to each window. The second pane from the bottom and the top can be opened in a push-out style. The second panes were slightly open but the upper windows appeared closed. These windows provided a view into the front (north) parking lot of the school. There was a book case along the entire north wall under the windows that stood approximately 2 feet 5 inches high and 1 foot 6 inches deep. The windows on the north wall had four (4) venetian blinds that covered two (2) windows each. The blinds were partially retracted covering the upper 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of the window. All the blinds were closed with the exception of the eastern-most blind that was open. The eastern-most blind appeared inconsistent with the other blinds, in that it was open and the bottom portion of the blind was hanging lower on the west side than the east

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side. There were posters across the lower portion of the windows partially but not completely limiting the view into the parking lot. There were stacks of items and supplies on the top of the bookcase under the windows that partially blocked the view from these eight (8) windows.

There were six (6) visible holes consistent with bullet holes in the metal framing of the top of the second pane of the third window from the east wall. There was one (1) hole in the glass on the lower east portion of the third pane of this same window. There were two (2) holes in the glass on the upper east portion of the second pane of this same window. One of the holes in the upper east side of the second pane was larger and visually contained one hole but due to the missing glass it was unclear if more than one (1) projectile caused this broken section of the window. All of these holes were consistent with bullet holes and there were <u>no less</u> than nine (9) holes in this window area. These holes and respective trajectory processing are described under the caption TRAJECTORY OF PROJECTILES IN ROOM #10.

This room appeared to be a typically furnished classroom, with two (2) clusters of desks and chairs. There was a cluster of eight (8) desks in the center of the room, south of a second cluster of eight (8) desks. These desks on the south center portion of the room were arranged like the letter "E" in an east to west direction. This cluster of desks measured approximately 13 feet north of the south wall and approximately 8 feet 9 inches east of the west wall and 9 feet 8 inches west of the east wall. The northern-most cluster of desks was arranged like an inverted letter "E" in an east to west direction. This cluster of desks measured approximately 17 feet north of the south wall and approximately 8 feet 5 inches east of the west wall and 10 feet 9 inches west of the east wall. The student desks were approximately 2 feet high, 2 feet wide and 1 foot 6 inches deep. The student desk chair was measured with an overall height of approximately 2 feet 4 inches, the seat bottom height was approximately 1 foot 4 inches and the depth of the chair was approximately 1 foot 2 inches.

There was a 14 foot 2 inch long shelf on the south wall west of the entrance door and east of the bathroom. This shelf was approximately 4 feet 7 inches high and one foot deep. There were coat hooks under the shelf that appeared to hold the personal belongings of the students, to include their backpacks. There was a rectangular table on the south side of the room, west of the entrance door.

There was a bathroom located within the classroom in the southwest corner of the room. This bathroom only contained a toilet and was measured to be approximately 4 feet 7 inches east to west and 3 feet 2 inches north to south. This bathroom had a door knob with a pushbutton locking device on the inside knob. The exterior knob had

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a key lock that could be used to unlock the door. This bathroom door opened inward and was hinged on the east side. On the west wall north of the bathroom door was a sink with under/over cabinets. There was a storage closet in the southeast corner of the room. The closet door had no locking mechanism.

There was a door that provided access into classroom #12 on the center south side of the west wall, approximately 8 feet 6 inches north of the bathroom. This door opened into classroom #12 and was hinged on the north side. This door knob had a key lock on both sides of the handle and was unlocked.

There was a semi-circular table adjacent to the northwest corner of the room. There were two small book cases positioned parallel to each other and perpendicular to the north wall east of the semi-circular table.

There was a smart board located in the center north side of the east wall, south of the teacher's desk. There was a speaker above the smart board. There was a large bulletin board with a smaller dry erase board attached to it along the east wall, south of the smart board. On the south side of the east wall attached to the bulletin board south of the dry erase board was an 8.5" by 11" piece of paper that was contaminated with a physiological substance. This paper was located on the east wall approximately 9 feet 1 inch from the south wall and 7 feet 6 inches from the floor. This piece of paper was seized as Exhibit #91.

There was a cream colored wall mounted telephone located on the south side of the east wall, north of the closet. An "Emergency Response Plan" packet was hanging on the south wall adjacent to the east side of the entrance door. This packet was above a map depicting the emergency evacuation route for this classroom. The "Emergency Response Plan" packet was seized as Exhibit #80.

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the south. Her left arm was extended perpendicular to the shoulder in an east direction and bent at the elbow in a north direction. She had a long gold colored neck chain around her neck that had her Sandy Hook Staff photo ID attached to it. The ID tag was grasped in her left hand. On the floor adjacent to the east side of her chest area was a set of keys to include a pink flamingo key fob. Mrs. Soto was wearing a green wool scarf, white long sleeve turtleneck sweater, green tank top, "Old Navy" brand blue jeans, black socks with green shamrocks, and calf-length brown colored boots. Jewelry was seized at autopsy to include silver colored with multi-colored leather neck chain with attached "Sandy Hook Staff Photo ID" in the name of Victoria Soto, four (4) rings (three gold colored and one silver colored) and two (2) pearl studded earrings. [Clothing was seized from OCME as Exhibit #55]

#### THE SHOOTER

An adult white male, later identified as **Adam Lanza** (d.o.b. 04/22/1992) #27 [OCME#12-17618] was located just east of the rectangular table and northwest of the hallway entrance door within classroom #10. The shooter was later determined to be approximately 6 feet tall and weighed approximately 112 pounds, according to Dr. Sue Williams of the Office of the Chief Medical Examiners.

The shooter was lying on his right side facing in an east direction. His head was positioned to the south and his feet positioned to the north. The shooter's left arm

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was along his left side with his forearm and hand across his lower back. His right arm was bent and underneath the right side of his body. His legs were bent slightly at the hips and knees with his knees in an east direction.

The following observations were made with the shooter located in his found position prior to moving his body. There was a blood-like substance on the left arm above and in the area of the left elbow. The shooter had reddish-brown hair and blue eyes and was wearing a pale green pocket vest over a black colored polostyle short sleeve shirt over a black t-shirt. He had yellow colored ear plugs in each ear. He was wearing black cargo pocket pants, black socks, black sneakers, a black canvas belt and black fingerless gloves on each hand. He had an empty drop holster that was affixed to his right thigh. This drop holster was black with a camouflaged padding affixed to the back (thigh side) of the holster and camouflage straps that secure the holster around the thigh. There were blood-like stains on the left lower portion of the green vest and the left trouser pocket of the black pants. There was tissue consistent with human tissue located on the outer portion of the left knee. There were blood-like stains consistent with a spatter pattern on the lower leg portion of both legs of the pants and the sneakers.

I observed an obvious injury to the right side and top front portion of the shooter's head consistent with bullet holes. There was a large pool of a blood-like substance on the carpet under and around the area of the shooter's head. Upon moving the shooter's body, two swabs of this blood-like stain were seized as Exhibit #90. These swabs were collected from the blood-like stain at a location of approximately 5 feet 4 inches from the south wall and 9 feet from the east wall. The shooter's clothing was seized during the autopsy at the OCME as Exhibit #83 (A-Q). Further photographic and written documentation was completed by Det. Walkley and Det. Keith relative to the shooter's clothing on January 17, 2013 (Refer to supplemental Shooter Clothing (Exhibit #83) Processing Report).

Weapons and Ammunitions on the Shooter's Person: (All weapons were made safe by assigned Evidence Detective Dan Sliby #810).

➤ Left upper breast pocket of the vest were a total of three (3) magazines seized as Exhibit #41 (Two (2) "Sig Sauer" magazines each containing twenty (20) live rounds of 9 mm ammunition and one (1) "Plus 2" magazine containing eighteen (18) rounds of live 9mm ammunition). Each magazine was loaded to full capacity.

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- ➤ Right upper breast pocket of the vest were a total of three (3) magazines seized as Exhibit #45 (two (2) "Sig Sauer" magazines each containing twenty (20) live rounds of 9 mm ammunition and one (1) "Glock 10mm" magazine containing fifteen (15) live rounds of 10 mm ammunition). Each magazine was loaded to full capacity.
- ➤ Right lower vest pocket were two (2) black "PMAG 30" magazines each containing thirty (30) live rounds of 5.56 mm ammunition (head stamp S&B 5.56x45). These magazines were seized as Exhibit #46. Each magazine was loaded to full capacity.
- ➤ Left front trouser pocket of pants was a Sig Sauer P226 semi-automatic 9 mm pistol that was seized as Exhibit 20 (One Sig Sauer P226 9mm, S/N UU676027 handgun with an empty chamber and a magazine of eighteen (18) "Speer 9mm Luger" live rounds). This magazine was loaded to full capacity.
- ➤ Left cargo pocket of pants contained one (1) live round of 5.56mm ammunition (head stamp S&B 5.56x45) that was seized as Exhibit #40.
- Right cargo pocket of pants contained one (1) green colored "Winchester" 12 gauge shotgun shell that was seized as Exhibit #39.
- ➤ Left rear pants pocket contained two (2) "Glock 10 mm" magazines each containing fifteen (15) live rounds of 10 mm ammunition. These magazines were seized as Exhibit #43. Each magazine was loaded to full capacity.
- ➤ Right rear pants pocket contained two (2) "Glock 10 mm" magazines each containing fifteen (15) live rounds of 10 mm ammunition. These magazines were seized as Exhibit #44. Each magazine was loaded to full capacity.

## 253 live rounds of ammunitions on the shooter's person:

9 mm: 116 rounds 10mm: 75 rounds 5.56 mm: 61 rounds 12 ga: 1 round

Located on the floor underneath the shooter was one (1) black "PMAG 30" magazine containing thirty (30) live rounds of 5.56 mm ammunition (head stamp S&B 5.56x45). This magazine was seized as Exhibit #42. This magazine was loaded to full capacity.

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Located on the floor east of the shooter was a "Glock" 10 mm semi-automatic pistol that was seized as Exhibit #19 (one "Glock" 10 mm, S/N SMA461). One round was partially loaded in the chamber, with a magazine of eight (8) rounds remaining). I observed this pistol to be lying on its left side pointed in a southwest direction. This pistol was measured to be approximately 2 feet 6 inches north of the hallway entrance door and approximately 2 feet 8 inches east of the suspect. This pistol appeared to be jammed with a partially open ejection port and one (1) live round of "10mm Auto" ammunition partially loaded into the chamber. This pistol contained one (1) "Glock 10mm" magazine that contained eight (8) live rounds of 10mm ammunition with the head stamp "10 mm Auto". (Magazines full capacity is 15). This pistol had numerous attached hairs to the front sight area of the pistol. These hairs were consistent in color with that of the shooter's hair. I observed one expended 10 mm casing located on the west side of the hallway entrance door in the area of the shooter. This expended casing was seized as part of Exhibit #37 (from the southwest quadrant of classroom #10). There were four (4) live rounds of 10 mm ammunition all with the head stamp "10mm AUTO" on the floor in the southeastern portion of the classroom which is also the area the shooter was located. These live rounds of 10mm ammunition were seized as Exhibits #22 thru #25. [NOTE: Four live 10 mm rounds found under the body, nine live 10 mm rounds in the pistol, and two expended 10 mm casings located = 15 rounds total, making a full capacity magazine]

A black colored "Flexfit" canvas "boonie-styled" hat was located on the floor northeast of the suspect. This hat was seized as Exhibit #21. This hat had blood-like stains, hairs and a hole consistent with a bullet hole in the forward portion of the top of the hat. This hole was consistent with having been worn by the shooter at the time the shooter received a bullet to the right rear lower portion of his head which exited out the top forward portion of his head and hat. There was a pair of small wire framed glasses on the floor north of Exhibit #19 (Glock 10 mm). These glasses had blood-like stains on them and appeared to be small and consistent with child size glasses. There was no deceased child in close proximity to the shooter's body.

### TRAJECTORY OF SUSPECTED SUICIDE SHOT

There was a hole consistent with a bullet hole located in the ceiling tile located approximately 8 feet 1 inch from the south wall and 5 feet 2 inches from the east wall. This hole was documented in photographs as "SBH #1 room 10". This projectile struck but did not penetrate a corrugated metal ceiling that was

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elevated and behind the ceiling tile. This strike was documented in photographs as "Strike #1 A". The projectile ricocheted and was later located above the ceiling tile in classroom 8 and seized as Exhibit # 98 (a lead and copper projectile). In the ceiling there was only a knee wall separating the two rooms. Trajectory documentation was completed on this hole with a documented horizontal angle (right (east) to left (west) of 66 degrees) and a vertical angle of 40 degrees from the floor. At a height of 5 feet along the path of this trajectory the muzzle would be located at approximately 7 feet 7 inches from the east wall and 7 feet 9 inches from the south wall.

Trajectory documentation, locations of blood-like stains, tissue, hair, and the shooter's body are all consistent with the shooter standing and facing in an east direction at the time of receiving a suspected self-inflicted gunshot wound to the right side of his head.

### "BUSHMASTER" semi-automatic rifle [Exhibit #17]

A Bushmaster caliber .223 rifle, model XM15-E2S with associated serial number L534858 was located on the floor of classroom #10 and was seized as Exhibit #17. This rifle was located west of the southern-most cluster of desks and east of the door on the west wall that provides access to classroom #12. This rifle was lying on its right side pointed in a northeast direction. This rifle had a shoulder strap that was attached in the front to the underside of the forearm in the area under the rear attachment for the front site. The rear portion of the sling attachment had become detached when a threaded nut failed and detached from the underside of the rear portion of the stock. The black threaded nut that was consistent with the sling attachment to the rifle was located on the floor in close proximity (approximately 2 feet northeast) of the rifle (Exhibit #17). This black thread nut was seized as Exhibit #33. It could not be determined whether the sling failed during use or when it was placed, thrown or dropped on the floor.

The rifle (Exhibit #17) was observed to be lying on the floor on its right side. The rifle safety indicator was on "FIRE". There was one (1) live round of 5.56 mm ammunition in the chamber and one (1) "PMAG 30" magazine in the magazine well, containing fourteen (14) live 5.56 mm rounds of ammunition. The charging handle was observed to be in the forward position with no obvious malfunctioning issues. The barrel of the rifle had a muzzle break.

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The barrel appeared to have a cha	alky residue on all sides of the	e muzzle break

to, and including, the front site. This weapon was made safe by assigned Evidence Detective Dan Sliby #810 with its configuration documented.

## CLASSROOM #10 (Continued)

On the floor within inches of the barrel of Exhibit #17 (Bushmaster Rifle), there were two (2) empty "PMAG 30" magazines duct taped together in a tactical configuration. These two (2) magazines were seized as Exhibit #18. There was one (1) live round of 5.56 mm ammunition located on the floor in close proximity to the west side of the barrel of Exhibit #17 (Bushmaster rifle). This round was seized as Exhibit #34.

## Search for casings and projectiles in classroom #10

Detective Sliby #810 measured equal distances on each wall of classroom #10 and cordoned off the room into four (4) quadrants. The southeast, southwest, northeast and northwest quadrants were established for purposes of collecting expended bullet casings and projectiles.

- NE Quadrant: Exhibit #36 (Fifteen (15) expended 5.56 mm casings and copper jackets and lead-like fragments)
- NW Quadrant: Exhibit #35 (one (1) expended 5.56 mm casing)
- SE Quadrant: Exhibit #38 (Twenty six (26) expended 5.56 mm casings)
- SW Quadrant: Exhibit #37 (Seven (7) expended 5.56 mm casings and one (1) expended 10 mm casing)

Six (6) lead projectiles were seized from the northwest quadrant and seized as Exhibits #26 and # 28 thru 32. One (1) lead projectile was seized as Exhibit #27 from the southwest quadrant near the door to classroom #12. One (1) lead and copper fragment with wood particles was seized as Exhibit #84 from the west wall approximately 8 inches from the floor and 1 foot 4 ½ inches from the south edge of the bookcase on the north wall. This projectile was in an area near the semi-circular table. There was a lead and copper like fragment that was seized as Exhibit #96 from the venetian blind on the north wall approximately 6 feet 8 inches from the floor and 4 ½ inches from the east wall. There was a copper jacketed projectile (seized as Exhibit #129) lodged in the top metal portion of the north corner of this bulletin board in an area above the teacher's desk. There was a lead and copper like fragment seized as Exhibit #85 from the top metal bulletin board frame on the east wall. This

As previously mentioned, in the metal framing of the top of the second pane of the third window from the east wall were six (6) visible holes consistent with bullet holes. There was one (1) hole in the glass on the lower east portion of the third pane of this same window. There were two (2) holes in the glass on the upper east portion of the second pane of this same window. One of the holes in the upper east side of the second pane was larger and visually contained one hole but due to the missing glass it was unclear if more than one (1) projectile caused this broken section of the window. All of these holes were consistent with bullet holes and there were no less than nine (9) holes in this window area. There was no tissue, hair or blood-like stains surrounding the areas of these holes.

The characteristics of the holes in the metal frame consisted of the metal being bent outward toward the parking lot. The characteristics of the holes in the glass window consisted of the inside of the glass around the hole being smooth and the concaved cone fracture being located on the outside of the glass. These characteristics of the holes observed in both the metal and glass portions of the window were consistent with these projectiles exiting classroom #10 in a direction toward the north parking lot.

Trajectory efforts were conducted on four (4) of the holes that were observed in the metal frame of the top portion of the second window pane. These holes were the only holes that had enough integrity to produce a low degree of variance when reconstructing the trajectory of these projectiles. These holes were identified as BH#1-4 for the purposes of trajectory in this room and should not be confused with documented bullet holes in the lobby that may have been identified with the same designation (BH#1-4). [NOTE: This window was partially open but the position of the window did not affect the trajectory as the metal frame was fixed and did not move with the window.]

## TRAJECTORY REPORT:

The trajectory performed within classroom #10 indicated that the four (4) projectiles were similarly traveling in a northeast direction along a similar path within classroom #10 in the area of the door to classroom #12 on the west wall and in the direction over the known location of the bodies of Anne Marie Murphy 01 02 03 12 and Victoria Soto. It was also evident that with the shooter's standing height approximately 6 feet, and the trajectory at a 1 to 2 degree upward path (+ or – 5 degree of reasonable variance) and at a height of approximately 5 feet from the floor, and a distance of approximately 29 feet to the west wall, these projectiles could have reasonably originated from any point along the trajectory path within this room.

The hole consistent with a bullet hole in the glass on the lower east portion of the third pane of the third window from the east wall was measured to its center to be approximately 7 feet from the east wall and 5 feet 6 inches from the floor. Trajectory was not performed on this hole due to the missing glass that compromised the integrity of the hole that is needed to produce a lowest degree of variance when reconstructing the trajectory of the projectile.

# Outdoor Trajectory

Three (3) vehicles parked in the north parking lot and located northeast of the windows of classroom #10 had damage consistent with bullet holes. These vehicles and the damage to each of these vehicles were documented by the CDMC Van Squad.

Trajectory was performed by members of the WDMC Van Squad on two (2) holes of the four (4) holes previously mentioned as being located in the top metal frame portion of the second window pane of the third window from the east wall of classroom #10. The laser was mounted on the trajectory rod and in both cases the laser terminated at a point on a vehicle struck, however, the actual hole on the vehicle was located three to four feet north of the laser area and on the same horizontal plane. That is to say that the point was the same height from the ground as the bullet hole but was three to four feet south of the actual hole. This information is consistent with the projectile having hit an intermediary barrier (metal window frame) at an angle and deflecting to its impact sight thereby not matching the actual straight direction of the laser end point. It should be noted that there was no damage consistent with a bullet hole or strike in the area of the laser end point on the vehicles. No further trajectory was attempted, by the WDMC Van Squad, from the window into the parking lot due to the previously demonstrated fact that the projectiles were deflected, from the intermediary object (the windows), and therefore such trajectory efforts would not glean any fruitful information.

# **CARPET and OTHER OBSERVATIONS**

There were numerous furrow holes consistent with bullet holes in the carpet area in the northwest quadrant in the area of the deceased victims and in most cases in an area that was under the victims. This carpet was cut and pulled back in an effort to recover any remaining lead projectiles with no projectiles located. A 14 feet 2 inches (east to west) and 11 feet 7 inches (north to south) section of carpet was cut from a point adjacent to the west wall with the northwest edge of the cutting approximately 5 feet 9 inches south of the north wall. The projectiles had in each case, penetrated through the carpet, through the tile located under the carpet and into the concrete flooring. The holes in the carpets and very few bullet holes in the west wall or north windows and bookcases, 03 12

Evidence of soot, charring and muzzle blast in the area of the bullet holes and of the clothing material of the victims' also indicates that many of these rounds of ammunition were shot 03 12

wall under the windows that stood approximately 2 feet 5 inches high and 1 foot 6 inches deep.

The windows on the north wall had four (4) venetian blinds that covered two (2) windows each. The western-most blind was fully retracted and the other three (3) blinds were extended half the length of the windows and closed. There were posters affixed to the three (3) extended blinds. There were stacks of items and supplies on the top of the bookcase under the windows that partially blocked the view from the bottom and second from the bottom panes of glass in these eight (8) windows.

This room appeared to be a typically furnished classroom, with three (3) clusters of desks and chairs. There was a cluster of five desks in the southeast and southwest side of the room. There was a cluster of six desks located in the center north side of the room. The center of the cluster of five desks in the southeast side of the room was measured to be approximately 9 feet 6 inches from the south wall and 17 feet 5 inches from the west wall. The center of the cluster of five desks in the southwest side of the room was measured to be approximately 11 feet 2 inches from the south wall and 8 feet 9 inches from the west wall. The center of the cluster of six (6) desks in the center north side of the room was measured to be approximately 17 feet 10 inches from the south wall and 13 feet 1 inch from the west wall.

The student desks were standard and measured to be approximately 2 feet high, 2 feet wide and 1 foot 6 inches deep. The student desk chair was measured with an overall height of approximately 2 feet 4 inches, the seat bottom height was approximately 1 foot 4 inches and the depth of the chair was approximately 1 foot 2 inches.

There were two (2) approximately 14 feet 2 inch long shelves on the south wall west of the entrance door and east of the bathroom. These shelves were located with one above the other. The first shelf was approximately 3 feet 4 inches high and the second shelf was approximately 5 feet 4 inches high and both were approximately one foot deep. There were coat hooks under the shelf that appear to hold the personal belongings of the students, to include their backpacks.

There was a bathroom located within the classroom in the southwest corner of the room. This bathroom only contained a toilet and was measured to be approximately 4 feet 7 inches east to west and 3 feet 1/2 inch north to south. This bathroom had a solid wood door and a door knob with a pushbutton locking device on the inside knob. The exterior knob had a key lock that could be used to unlock the door.

The bathroom door opened inward and was hinged on the east side. On the west wall, north of the bathroom door, was a sink with under/over cabinets. There was a storage closet in the southeast corner of the room. The closet door had no locking mechanism.

There was a rectangular table located adjacent to the book cases on the center west wall. There was a semi-circular table adjacent to the center portion of the north wall. The teacher's desk was positioned in the northeast corner. There was a purse on the desk chair at the teacher's desk with a Connecticut driver's license #187347431 in the name of Lauren Rousseau (d.o.b. 03 ). This purse also contained an iPhone and \$30.00 in US cash currency (1 twenty and 1 ten dollar bill). On the teacher's desk was the "Substitute plan for Amanda D'Amato" dated 12/14/2012. Mrs. D'Amato was documented in the main office as being absent on 12/14/2012 and having Miss Rousseau as a substitute teacher for her class in classroom #8. The Substitute Plan documented from 9:00 am-9:15 am-morning work, 9:20-9:30 Morning Meeting, and 9:30-1015-Writing. (SEE ATTACHED COPY OF PAGES 1 and 2 OF THE SUBSTITUTE PLAN AND STAFF ATTENDANCE SHEET).

There was a door located on the north side of the east wall behind the teacher's desk. This door opened inward to classroom #6 and was hinged on the north side. This door knob was unlocked and had key locks on both sides of the door.

There was a smart board located in the center north side of the east wall, south of the teacher's desk. There was a speaker above the smart board. There was a large bulletin board with a smaller dry erase board attached to it along the east wall, south of the smart board. There was a cream colored wall mounted telephone located on the south side of the east wall, north of the closet. An "Emergency Response Plan" packet dated August 8, 2012 was hanging on the south wall adjacent to the east side of the entrance door. This packet was above a map depicting the emergency evacuation route for this classroom. The "Emergency Response Plan" packet was seized as Exhibit #81.

### **DECEASED VICTIMS in Classroom #8:**

The deceased children of classroom #8 were originally located by CSP-Sergeant William Cario to be inside the bathroom with the bathroom door in the fully opened position. # TRAJECTORY REPORT (Classroom #8):

BR #1 and BR#2 were measured to be approximately 2 feet and 2 feet 8 inches from the floor with a 6 and 1 degree vertical angles respectively, in an 85 degree east to west horizontal angle. (+ or – 5 degrees of reasonable variance). This information, with respect to the room being measured approximately 27 feet (north to south) and the shooter being approximately 6'0" tall, would indicate that these two projectiles could have reasonably originated at <u>any point</u> along the trajectory path within this room provided there were no intermediary objects in their path. This determination is based on standard average muzzle heights ranges of 48 inches, 54 inches and 60 inches.

BH#34 and BH #35 were measured to be approximately 2 feet 4 inches and 3 feet 6 inches from the floor with a 20 degree and 12 degree vertical angle respectively, in a northeast to southwest direction. (+ or -5 degrees of reasonable variance). This information, with respect to the shooter being approximately 6'0" tall, would indicate that if the shooter was positioned with his feet on the floor (as there was no evidence to indicate otherwise), the position of the muzzle would be reasonably no further away than a range of approximately 2 feet to approximately 4 feet from either BH #34 or #35. (Range determination based on standard average muzzle height ranges of 48 inches, 54 inches and 60 inches)

# PROCESSING OF BLOOD SPATTER PATTERNS

On the west wall adjacent to the north side of the bathroom was a sink with white colored over and under wall cabinets. There was a paper towel dispenser affixed to the south wall (north bathroom wall). The lower sink cabinet was measured to be approximately 2 feet 4 inches high (includes 3 ½ inch toe kick under cabinet), 4 feet 11 inches wide and 2 feet 1 inch deep. The over cabinet was located approximately 1 foot 8 inches above the lower sink cabinet. The upper cabinet was measured to be approximately 4 feet 10 inches wide, 3 feet high and 1 foot 2 inches deep.

The over-the-sink cabinet had two pairs of doors on the east face of the cabinet. One pair of cabinet doors was on the south side and one pair was on the north side of the east face of the cabinet. There were distinguishable impact spatter patterns of a blood-like substance on the southern-most cabinet door (later seized as Exhibit #97). There were also distinguishable impact spatter patterns of a blood-like substance on the cinder block wall above and to the west of the paper towel dispenser located adjacent to the south side of the sink on the exterior north wall of the bathroom.

These two (2) areas of spatter patterns were processed to determine the area of origin. Yellow colored string was used for photographic purposes of the processing of the spatter pattern (Pattern #1) that was located on the face of the southern-most cabinet. Orange string was used for photographic purposes of the processing of the spatter pattern (Pattern #2) that was located on the cinder block wall south of the sink and on the exterior side of the north wall of the bathroom.

The following are the measurements taken and angles determined for each of the impact stains from each of the patterns to determine the areas of origin.

An area of origin was observed to be located approximately 8 inches east of the southern-most cabinet face, 1 foot 5 inches from the exterior side of the north bathroom wall and 5 feet 6 inches from the floor. This information would suggest that the victim who was impacted, presumably either teacher, Rachel D'Avino or Lauren Rousseau, was in a standing position and slightly over the sink area at the time of impact.

Locations of the drops of blood-like stains are seized on Exhibit #97 (Southern-most cabinet door). The bottom of the cabinet door was approximately 4 feet 1 and 1/8<sup>th</sup> inches from the floor. The top of the cabinet door was approximately 1 and 1/16 inches below the top of the cabinet that was located 5 feet 1 inch from the floor. This cabinet door was located approximately 1 foot 2 inches extended from the west wall. The southern edge of the cabinet door was located approximately 1 and 13/16<sup>th</sup> inches from the exterior side of the north wall of the bathroom. The cabinet door (Exhibit #97) was measured to be approximately 1 foot and 9/16ths of an inch wide and 2 feet 9 and 13/16ths inches tall.

An area of origin was observed to be located approximately 1 foot east of the southern-most cabinet face, 1 foot from the exterior side of the north bathroom wall and 5 feet 8 inches from the floor. This information would suggest that the victim who was impacted, presumably either teacher, Rachel D'Avino or Lauren Rousseau, was in a standing position and slightly over the sink area at the time of impact.

## BALLISTIC EVIDENCE IN CLASSROOM #8

Three (3) black colored "PMAG 30" magazines were located on the floor in the southeast side of the room, adjacent to the area of the coat hooks along the south wall from which the children stored their backpacks. These magazines were seized as Exhibit #47. One of the magazines was empty, one of the magazines had ten (10) live rounds of 5.56 mm ammunition and one of the magazines had thirteen (13) live rounds of 5.56 mm ammunition. One (1) live round of 5.56 mm ammunition was seized as Exhibit #48 from the southeast portion of the classroom and east of the magazines seized as Exhibit #47.

# Search for casings and projectiles in classroom #8

Detective Sliby #810 measured equal distances on each wall of classroom #8 and cordoned off the room into four (4) quadrants. The southeast, southwest, northeast and northwest quadrants were established for purposes of collecting expended bullet shell casings and projectiles.

#### CLASSROOM #6

Classroom #6 was located on the north side of the north hallway and was the fourth classroom east of the front lobby and approximately 27 feet east of classroom #8. This classroom was accessed from a door that was recessed within the north side of the north hallway. As previously mentioned, the door opened outward (toward the hallway) and was wooden with a large circular window in the upper portion. This door was hinged on the east side. This window was partially covered on the inside of the window by a wooden "Apple" designed decoration. The door could only be locked by using a key on the exterior door handle key lock. The interior door handle had no locking mechanism. This room was carpeted with painted cinderblock walls. Florescent ceiling lights automatically turned on when entering the room.

There was a door on the north side of the west wall that provided access into classroom #8. This door opened inward to classroom #6 and was hinged on the north side. This door knob was unlocked and had key locks on both sides of the door.

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## INTERCOM SYSTEM

All the office desks had a black hardline desk phone with a video screen that could view the person at the front door through the call box system. On Julie Obre's desk was a tan vintage push button hard line telephone with handwriting on the lower portion under the buttons that read "BAT PHONE." Pressing the pound sign (#) and the number "1" on this phone opened the Intercom System that could be heard throughout the school.

On 01/03/2012 it was learned with the assistance of Det. Mudry that the intercom system could be accessed from nine (9) phones located within seven (7) rooms. These rooms were: three (3) phones in the main office, the principal's office, the nurse's office (room #57), room #9 (conference room), room #29 (southwest side of school-FREDA), room #32 (southwest side of school-AMANZIO), room #60 (portable classrooms attached to the south side of school). The "All Call" which opens the intercom to the entire school was accessed by pressing "# 0" from the phones in the previously mentioned 7 locations. The "All Call-except the quiet rooms" opens the intercom to the school with the exception of the designated quiet rooms. This option was accessed by pressing "# 1" from the phones in the previously mentioned seven (7) locations. (REFER TO DETECTIVE MUDRY'S NEXGEN REPORT #0004165 RELATIVE TO THE INTERCOM SYSTEM).

# THE PRINCIPAL'S OFFICE

The principal's office was accessed from within the main office through a door on the east wall. The personal effects of this office were documented by me and witnessed by CSP- WDMC Lieutenant DelVecchia. This office had a black purse and a "Coach" wallet containing the personal documents and the driver's license of Dawn L. Hochsprung (d.o.b. 06/28/1965). Also within this purse was one (1) twenty dollar bill in the purse, a set of three (3) keys to include a key to a "Chevy" and a "Ford" vehicle. Also in her purse was a green and white "iPhone". There was a "Valentino" bag that contained home school folders in the name of Dawn Hochsprung. There was an empty multi-colored bag with flowers within the office. These items were removed by LT. DelVecchia on 12/15/2012 at 1630 hours. A red case with an iPad was located in the Conference Room #9 in front of the tagged seating place of Dawn Hochsprung. This iPad was removed on 12/15/2012 by LT. DelVecchia at approximately 1636 hours.
